

## Debbie Angle Community Service Scholarship Fund

**Purpose:** The Debbie Angle Community Service Scholarship Fund (DACSSF) serves multiple purposes. It is intended to promote community service action amongst youth in the Silver Valley, provide additional funding for higher education, and preserve Debbie Angle's legacy of her commitments to community service. Silver Valley residents, and others.

**Debbie:** For those who did not know Debbie Angle, she spent countless hours dedicated to helping others. In addition to her extreme dedication to her over 30 years of service within the financial industry; she held numerous offices, was a valuable committee member, and an active part of the communities within the Silver Valley. For example, Debbie actively worked with the Kellogg Chamber of Commerce, the Wallace Chamber of Commerce, and the Idaho Special Olympics. She served vital roles in organizing community functions such as Silver Hoops, the Huckleberry Festival, the Wallace Lighting Festival, and so on. Aside from the preceding examples of her commitment to community service, Debbie's initial diagnosis of pancreatic cancer in 2003 evolved her commitment to others to include a commitment to individuals affected by cancer. She was a valuable part of the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network (PANCAN), the Silver Valley Cancer Resource Center, and the Silver Valley's annual Relay for Life. Debbie balanced her numerous roles in each of these commitments with work and family even while enduring the harmful effects of chemotherapy, radiation, and other cancer related illnesses.

### Scholarship

**Description:** The DACSSF is a non-profit corporation licensed and incorporated in the states of Washington and Idaho that remains committed to awarding a single one-time \$500 scholarship per year to a Silver Valley Student. The scholarship is funded through donations from a combination of personal and area business donations. It is intended to be competitive between the Wallace, Kellogg, and Mullan School Districts and will be awarded to one applicant each spring. Applicants must be able to display proof of acceptance into a regionally accredited school of higher education in order to be considered eligible for the award. The award is intended for a student who demonstrates an exemplary commitment to community service. Each year's recipient will be selected by the DACSSF's Board of Directors based on their commitments to community service, professionalism, and excellence as demonstrated through the application process and its criteria.

## Criteria for the Debbie Angle Community Service Scholarship Award

Consideration for the Debbie Angle Community Service Scholarship Award is based on full completion and submittal of the following criteria by 12:00 A.M. Pacific Time on April 30, 2013. Applicants must submit a combination of the following:

**Completed Application:** Each Section of the Application [DACSSF (2013) Form 3] shall be completed. In the event that the applicant does not know the requested information or the information does not apply to the applicant, it shall be marked **N/A**. Unanswered application questions will deem an application incomplete and will result in disqualification from the award process.

**2 Reference Letters:** The reference letters shall include one letter from a teacher and one from an individual in the community, (non-relative include the author's name, contact information, signature, and date, along with a description of the author's association with the applicant.

**Proof of College Acceptance or Current Enrollment:** Proof of college acceptance or current enrollment in a regionally accredited college or university is required before scholarship funds can be awarded.

### **Most Recent Official High School Transcripts.**

**Essay:** In addition to the completed application, two reference letters, proof of college acceptance, and official high school transcripts, the applicant must Submit a **300-500 word** essay on the following:

**Explain what type(s) of community service you have done up to this point in your life, including how long you have been a part of these activities. Then, explain how a college education might help you expand on your level of community involvement.**

The essay shall be typed in a size 12 Times New Roman font with 1" top, bottom, and side margins. It should be double spaced and include basic components of an essay such as an introduction, body, and conclusion. Any unoriginal work shall be properly credited through the use of either APA or MLA citations to avoid disqualification for plagiarism.

A combination of the completed application, " reference letters, and essay assignments must be submitted no later than **12:00 A.M. Pacific Time on April 30, 2013**. These components should be submitted together either via mail or electronic mail (e-mail) according, to the following instructions:
